

Staff Packing List

Essential Items

NOTE: Staff laundry machines are available at camp. So you only need to bring enough clothing to last one or two weeks. Do not over pack as storage space in cabins is limited.

- ❑ A WATCH!!! –You will not be able to use your phone to look at the time during the day.
- ❑ Bedding: warm blanket or sleeping bag, fitted single sheet and flat sheet, pillow with pillowcase (some of our staff beds are full-sized beds, so you might want to bring one full sized fitted sheet)
- ❑ Clothing (shorts, long pants, tee shirts, long sleeved shirts) Camp clothing is casual and informal, but within the bounds of good taste. No ripped jeans, or ripped T-shirts.
- ❑ Comfortable walking shoes or hiking boots (sturdy sneakers are fine) , Teva “style” sandals and Birkenstocks “styles” are allowed – anything with straps around the top and back of your feet. CROCS are permitted at appropriate times as well.
- ❑ Underwear, lots of nice smelling socks, sleepwear
- ❑ Rainwear (poncho or rain jacket)
- ❑ Fleece, sweatshirt or sweater
- ❑ 2 Towels (one for swimming and one for showering)

- ❑ Swimsuit (Remember - ONE PIECE ONLY on camp premises. BUT...on days off you can wear what you want.), water shoes or sandals.
- ❑ Sun hat and/or sunglasses
- ❑ Toiletries (soap, shampoo, toothbrush and toothpaste, hairbrush and comb)
- ❑ Sunscreen and insect repellent
- ❑ Flashlight and batteries
- ❑ Water Bottle – A great thing to have at camp to avoid dehydration (Water bottles with the camp logo can be bought at the camp store)
- ❑ An Alarm Clock- you will not be able to wake up to your phone –since cell phones are not allowed in the cabins.

Optional Items

(please label all valuable items below with your name)

- ❑ Your favorite coffee/tea mug (it’s nice to have your own – and it also helps keep the camp coffee cups in the dining hall)
- ❑ Musical Instruments –guitar, harmonica... (if you play a musical instrument, definitely bring it to camp). We do have a piano at camp. There are many chances to play music (music workshops, campfire sharing, chilling in the lodge)
- ❑ Journal, stationery, envelopes, stamps or books to read

Staff Packing List

- ❑ Readings, poetry, songs for campfire
- ❑ Daypack and laundry bag
- ❑ Fun, funky, or dress-up clothes for banquet
- ❑ Camera (labeled clearly with your name)
- ❑ White T-shirt or other white clothing items for Tye-Dying
- ❑ IPOD with your favorite music (for quiet cabin times). But please don't bring loud speakers since we try to keep music volume to a minimum at camp. Personal listening devices are not allowed outside of the cabin and should not be used with headphones while on duty.
- ❑ Prescription medications with doctors orders (these need to be kept in the infirmary - we do have common over-the-counter medications at camp (tylenol, advil, benydryl, sudafed, mylanta, etc.) so there's no need to bring those as we don't allow medications to be kept in the cabins during the camp sessions)

General Packing Notes

- ❑ Label as many of your possessions as you can (especially cameras, water bottles, towels, laptops, etc. — the items that you might leave around camp. It's so much easier to retrieve a lost item if it has your name on it. And when there are 100 campers at camp it's even harder to

keep track of things. And it's also easier to avoid losing clothing in the laundry areas if labelled.

- ❑ Laptop Computers –We don't have a place to store them at camp, and they can not be stored in your cabin. There wont be many times you can use this at camp.
- ❑ Cell phone (there is poor cell phone service at camp.) We will have a place to keep your cell phone since they are not allowed in the cabin, and you can not carry them during the day.
- ❑ You can pack your clothes in a suitcase that can slide under a bunkbed, or you can bring an under-bed plastic bin for your clothing or you can pack your stuff in a large tote bag. Counselors usually change cabins each session, so pack in something that's easy to move from cabin to cabin.

What Not To Bring

- ❑ Weapons, Fireworks, Cigarettes, Alcohol, Illegal Drugs, Matches, Lighters, Laser Pointers, Electronic Games, Pornographic materials, Loud Music Speakers, Pets.
- ❑ NO FLIP FLOPS-“If it goes between the toes it's a NO!”. Absolutely no flip flops can be worn on camp, except in the bathroom, and only in the bathrooms.
